The Lewis Family has been inviting guests to their home for more than 20 years.

Everett and Kathy Lewis said their lights "dance" to nearly 30 Christmas songs that are broadcast on 106.9 FM.

“We are very excited to start the season,” Everett told NBC 10. “everything is the same but we added many more LED lights.”

Everett went on to say that some of the most notable props in their display include their new Pixel Ribbon Tree, plus a 23-foot tall evergreen with 16 strands of lights, as well as leaping arches, star bursts, and shooting stars. There are also blow molds, as well as inflatable Christmas characters.

“Over 100 extension cords are used to control each component of our light show,” Everett said, also adding that there will be plenty of appearances by Santa.

The family is accepting donations on behalf of The Autism Project, as well as the Gloria Gemma ccc.

“We raised \$2,630 for The Autism Project last year,” Everett said. “Thank you to the many people who help with the charity.”

The display starts Friday night and runs through New Year's Eve. The hours are 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. Sunday through Thursday, and 5 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday, with Santa making a visit again this year.

“We have 3,000 candy canes to give out to all the kids when they visit,” Everett said.
